Notice of new Mexican Customs Process.

Dear Customer / Colleague.

Related to our latest advisory about the new Mexican Customs process called ANSI-X12, with which ONE started test on August 16TH 2021; be advised that based on Customs authority notification the new format is now in production **since February 1^{st,} 2022.** We reiterate the importance to send mandatory information to submit your customs declaration to SAT.

The shipper must send their documentation with the following mandatory information, considering the transmission will be made 48 hours prior to the arrival of the ship at the loading port:

Pieces, measure unit	Total pieces (sum per BL)
Total, Weight, measure unit	Cargo description, Marks & Numbers
Volume unit	HS Code
Packing type	Measure unit
BL type	Cargo weight
Place of receipt	Cargo Origin
Shipper, Consignee, Notify	Dangerous goods UN/NA
Name, RFC or TAX ID, Address (State Code)	Class
Person Contact (e-mail, phone number)	Description
CTNR Type, CTNR number, Seals	Flashpoint
Service Type (FCL-LCL)	Measure unit for Flashpoint temperature

Please remind this rule will apply to all export, import and transshipment cargo that has operations in Mexican ports. If there is any missing mandatory information, the system will reject the manifest of your shipment and will be subject to fines that will be responsibility of Shipper, Consignee and/or Notify. Any correction without penalization must be done 48HRS prior to the vessel arrival at the loading port, any subsequent correction will be subject to fines.
